

Finding homes for the homeless: That's what HPPL does, but there are some of us who have a greater need than other HPPL dogs and cats. We're the ones who've been boarded in a kennel for various reasons: maybe our foster home had to let us go—sometimes fosters can't do it forever, and we didn't find a forever home in time; we were returned from an adoption, and our foster had already taken in new foster pets and had no room for us; a few of us were rescued from Katrina's aftermath, and although HPPL got us out, there weren't enough fosters for us. HPPL never turns away an animal they've committed to, but sometimes they have to be creative about housing us. They pay for us to stay here but we would really like to be in a home. Our first choice is to find our forever home; our second choice is to find a foster home. Please read our stories and pass them on. We'd be so happy if even one of us found a home this month.

My friends being boarded in kennels have it doubly bad. Not only are they waiting for their forever homes, but they don't even have a nice comfortable home to stay in like most of us do, until they find their forever home. This means that they are sadder, more bored and restless than my friends with foster homes and forever homes. There are less humans to play, touch and care for them. Their space is confined, there are no long walks and fun toys for the most part. Of course it goes without saying that the best possible thing that could happen to an HPPL dog or cat that is being boarded is that they would find a loving home through being permanently adopted. But, short of that there are other ways that our human friends can help...

Foster Homes. Even just providing a foster home until a kenneled dog or cat can be adopted can

be extremely beneficial for that pet. Being in a loving and caring foster home gives me the chance to

Designated Donations. If you're not able to physically care for any of us, it would still be helpful to us — and more importantly, to HPPL — to receive a donation that's marked especially for the care of the kenneled animals. That way HPPL knows that it can spend that same amount of money on other important projects like spaying and neutering those cats and dogs that enter our program who haven't yet been altered.

HPPL. She was born for us. -B




Photo of Toby and Emily submitted by Glay Posch. Toby was with us in the kennel for quite some time because he is a narrous guy
