#### HPPL SPONSORSHIP

As part of our 25th year, HPPL is extending its mission through the support of two other incredible nonprofit organizations. The first is the Texas Litter Control clinic who partners with us to alter community cats through a variety of programs. In 2014, HPPL and TLC will work together to provide free surgery assistance to cat owners on public assistance, to spay/neuter feral cats, and to educate the public about the importance of altering every animal. In addition, HPPL's new friend is the Rescued Pets Movement established in September 2013 to pull adoptable animals from BARC (the City Animal Control Agency) and transport them to a variety of groups in Colorado who have foster care as well as adopters waiting. HPPL is providing assistance with the medical needs of these animals prior to their "ride" from death's doorstep to a new life. Please check out both TLC and RPM; you'll like what you see.
