Dear Friend,

How did a little puppy find his way under a vacant house? Once there, he was so frightened that he growled at the lady trying to help him. But soon with a big plate of food, he was lured out. It didn't take much coaxing to allow a leash to be put on him and then he was rescued. Like many animals, HPPL is contacted about, JJ only needed some basic medical care and a foster home willing to work on the training a puppy needs. He has gone through his first viewing at the mobile adoption site and won rave reviews for his friendliness and handsome appearance.

The same day JJ went to the vet, so did Kyle. But his story illustrates the more intense work that HPPL does. Kyle had parvo and only through one week of concentrated treatments from a dedicated veterinary staff was he able to survive. Currently, he is in his foster home gaining strength, learning to snuggle and even playing a bit with toys. HPPL's mission is to help both of these types of animals. 
